The Pacolet Area in the 1950 US Federal Census

The US Federal Census for 1950 has been released. The portion dealing with Pacolet has been placed on this website. The census records are available from a Federal website. However, it is difficult to find records on the site and to see them once you find them. The census records for the Pacolet area have been copied and put in a much more "user friendly" form on this Pacolet Memories website. The Pacolet vicinity was divided into seven parts for the census. Each area is entered as a separate article on this website. To read the article click on the links below.

Part 1 - Pacolet Area (42-71)

The official description given on the census for this part reads as follows:

(Pacolet township, outside Cowpens town: Pacolet town)

Some, but not all, of the roads and streets listed in this part are - Glenn Springs Rd., Wood Street, Main St., Fleming Street, Pine St., Railroad Street, Church St., Union Street, and Sloan Street.

Much of this part is in the community of **Pacolet Station**

Part 2 - Pacolet Area (42-72)

The official description given on the census for this part reads as follows:

(Pacolet Mills, unincorporated: Pacolet Mills, unincorporated - That part Bounded by County line; County line; Pacolet River; Pacolet River, Unnamed stream)

Some, but not all, of the roads and streets listed in this part are -

Cleveland Street, Green Street, Granite St. (Tightwad), Moore Street and Limestone Street

This part of the census deals mostly with the part of the <u>Pacolet Mills</u> village that is located north of the <u>Pacolet River</u>. It also includes a small area that is north of the river but is not in the mill village.

Part 3 - Pacolet Area (42-73)

The official description given on the census for this part reads as follows:

(Pacolet Mills, unincorporated - That part Bounded by Pacolet River; Limestone, Montgomery, Southern Railway (spur); Pacolet town limits; Unnamed stream)

The census refers to SC Hwy. 18. However, this is now Hwy 150 that connects **Pacolet Mills** and **Pacolet Station**. This part continues coverage of the mill village. It covers Montgomery Ave., Goodlet Street, Stone St., Milliken St., Cameron, and Brewster Street, that goes out to the **Ball Park**.

It covers the neighborhood of <u>Victor Park</u> (Boss Line) including the <u>hotel</u> which it refers to as the Victor Park Inn. The census taker then heads back towards <u>Pacolet Station</u> going south on Highway 150 and interviewing the people in the the houses on the eastern side of the highway.

Part 4 - Pacolet Area (42-74)

The official description given on the census for this part reads as follows:

(Pacolet Mills, unincorporated - That part Bounded by Pacolet River; Unnamed stream; County Rd. 1270; Montgomery, Limestone.)

Some, but not all, of the roads and streets listed in this part are:

Montgomery Ave., Fleming Street, Stone Street, Walker Street, and County Road 1270 (Now called Sutton Road.)

This Part finishes the <u>Pacolet Mills</u> village houses that were started in Part 3. Much of it involves the houses on Walker Street which is also known as "Back Line". It also covers part of the <u>Can Hollow</u> community (County Road 1270 or Sutton Road) and areas around it.

Part 5 - Pacolet Area (42-78)

The official description given on the census for this part reads as follows:

(Pacolet township - That part south of Lawsons Fork Creek and Pacolet River and north of Southern Railway, outside Pacolet town and the unincorporated place of Pacolet Mills)

This part covers some of the Glenn Springs Road, some of what was <u>Camp Croft</u> and the community of <u>Whitestone</u>.

Part 6 - Pacolet Area (42-77)

The official description given on the census for this part reads as follows:

(Pacolet township - That part south of Southern Railway and northeast of Isons Creek, outside Pacolet town.)

What the Census refers to as Hwy 176 is now SC Hwy 9. It is the main Hwy through **Pacolet Station**.

Part 7 - Pacolet Area (42-76)

The official description given on the census for this part reads as follows:

(Pacolet township - That part south of Southern Railway and southwest of Isons Creek (Remainder of Pacolet township is in Cowpens town)).

This part covers several areas near Pacolet that are not connected. Includes what is now Sunny Acres Road, <u>Quarry Rd</u>., <u>Mayesville</u>, part of <u>Can Hollow</u> and part of what is now Sutton Road. Also, includes <u>Pumpkin Center</u>.
