The following clipping was submitted to the group "NC/SC Historic Textile Mill Villages" by Mr. Eddie Waits. The clipping is from 1939 and probably from the *Spartanburg Herald Journal*. As you can see, it is about a little girl named Janice K. Cook, recently born in Pacolet. Janice, when she was born, had 12 living grandparents as described in the story. The statement is made in the story that, at the time, little Janice probably had more living grandparents than anyone else in South Carolina. It is almost certain that many people now living in the Pacolet community are related to the people listed in the story. As a child, I knew some of the people, such as Mr. and Mrs. Dewey Cook.

Since Janice was born in July of 1939, it is also almost certain that she was born at home and delivered by Dr. Hill. My brother, David (Dink) was born in Pacolet in April 1939 and delivered by Dr. Hill. You can read more about Dr. Hill at <u>http://pacoletmemories.com/drhill.html</u>.
